English

Reading a novel:

Students will read with the purpose of recognizing and making inferences based upon themes, characters and setting within the novel 'The Island of the Blue Dolphins'. By determining central ideas or themes of the text, pupils will be able to analyze character development, word choice, and assess point of view.

English Social Studies

Mesopotamia:

Students study the origins of human beings and the early civilizations that flourished in Mesopotamia. They study the religions, governments, trade, philosophies, and art of this civilization as well as the powerful ideas that arose in the ancient world and profoundly shaped the course of world history. These ideas include monotheism, democracy, the rule of law, individual worth, personal responsibility, the alphabetic principle for a writing system, and scientific reasoning where applicable to Mesopotamia.

Math

Integers

Students will understand that...

- Knowledge of positive and negative integers are important in understanding and interpreting related real-world situations.
- By understanding and recognizing when the sum or product of two integers is positive or negative, one is able to make a number of inferences.
- There are constant rules applied to adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing integers.
- Understand that rewriting an expression in different forms in a problem context can shed light on the problem and how the quantities in it are related.
- The value of an absolute value, and its distance from zero on a number line

Science

Cells

Students will learn the structure and function of both animal and plant cells and their organelles. Students will examine cells under a microscope in order to sketch diagrams of different specialised cells and consider how and why these cells are different in structure and size. During this topic students will complete an analogy project for their choice of plant or animal cell where they will relate the functions of different organelles to everyday life.

Students will be able to:

- State The Cell Theory and describe how this theory was developed.
- Examine cells under a microscope.

- Identify the organelles present in eukaryotic cells and state the difference between eukaryotes and prokaryotes.
- Compare and Contrast animal and plant cells.
- Draw a diagram showing the levels of organisation of life.
- State basic needs of an organism and which organelles are responsible for meeting these needs.

PE

Health Unit description:

This course aims to equip students with the relevant skills, knowledge and abilities in order for them to make informed healthy choices throughout their lifetime, which will encourage them to partake in lifelong physical activity and lifelong healthy eating habits. The focus of the course will be on individual reflection and identifying personalized targets for students, while the purpose will be to ensure all students have a working knowledge of how the body works and how diet and exercise can help develop an efficient and healthy body. Focusing mainly on developing a 2 week physical activity log, and evaluating their performance in order to make adjustments.

Physical Unit Description:

This HRF Module helps to achieve the standards set out by SHAPE America, as it will help the students to demonstrate their command of rhythm and timing, their ability to participate in moderate to vigorous exercise, as well as encourage students to take responsibility for and ownership of their personal fitness levels. The focus will be on developing isolated fitness components, as well as applying them to specialized exercises and movements. Students continue to be encouraged to cooperate with and encourage classmates; accept individual differences and demonstrate inclusive behaviors; and engage in physical activity for enjoyment and self-expression. The purpose of this module is to develop each individual's physical capacity while allowing freedom to create and self-express in a cooperative and safe environment.

ICT

Introduction to Edmodo and Mac Basics

This unit has been designed to provide students with the skills, confidence and knowledge to independently access, save and submit work electronically via Edmodo.

They will also learn a number of transferable skills including how to:

- Create, save, delete, retrieve and rename files and folders
- Differentiate between and effectively use 'save' and 'save as'
- Format a document appropriately to suit the needs of a targeted audience
- Search for, save and insert images appropriate for purpose

Drama

Performance of a Play

This course will reaffirm the foundations of their continuing Drama exploration, and will continue to inspire the learners in the power of their imaginations. During this course, they will expand and develop their confidence, creativity and communication skills. This Drama course re-introduces the basic theatre standards of acting, directing and writing- and combines these techniques with the common core standards of creating, performing and responding. The students will understand the process and art of script work, and begin to understand the depth and understanding required to transform a character from page, to stage. Students will understand and apply characterization to a script, collaborating as an ensemble of actors. The learners will be required to practice and apply the process of characterisation to all elements of this unit, embodying the art of playing a character with truth and creativity.

French

This course enables students to develop their communication skills in French and to gain an understanding of the culture of France and other French speaking countries. The course aims to develop students listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in French with an emphasis on communication. Introductory Core French gives students the opportunity to experience language learning, ensuring they make informed decisions when selecting electives in the future.

Unit 1 - Je me présente! - I introduce myself!

Language content:

- Students will be able to greet each other in French and ask 'how are you'
- Students will be able to introduce themselves to other people - say/ask their name, age, where they live, birthday, etc.
- Students will be able to understand and follow instructions in French
- Students will be able to use the numbers upto 20

Grammar:

- Students will get introduced to French grammar - masculine and feminine, verbs, personal pronouns, etc

Cultural aspect:

- Students become aware of similarity and differences in Arabic and French cultures
