تتمحور الوحدة الثانية حول أحوال العرب في شبه الجزيرة العربية وتنقسم إلى قسمين. الأول عن أحوال العرب في شبه الجزيرة قبل ظهور الإسلام حيث ستتعرف الطالبات إلى الحياة السياسية وقتها، الحياة الدينية والاجتماعية والحياة الاقتصادية. أما القسم الثاني، فهو عن التاريخ الحديث والمعاصر لدول شبه الجزيرة العربية حيث ستتعرف الطالبات إلى تاريخ الدول التالية: المملكة العربية السعودية، الكويت، مملكة البحرين، قطر، سلطنة عمان والجمهورية اليمنية.

ستتعلم الطالبة في هذه الوحدة الجزء الثاني من سورة " ق " وتسمع الآيات الكريمة مراعية أحكام التلاوة وتفسر معاني المفردات وتبين المعنى الإجمالي للآيات الكريمة كما ستوضح مظاهر علم الله تعالى وعدله، كما ستسمع حديث التوبة مراعية قواعد القراءة السليمة وتستنتج شروط التوبة النصوح وتوضح الأمور التي تعين على التوبة وتنتقد الممارسات الخطأ في باب التوبة، وستتعلم عن اسم الله المغيث الحليم جل جلاله موضحة مفهومي المغيث والحليم جل جلاله وتذكر بعض مظاهر الحلم الإلهي في الحياة وتدلل على التخلق بخلق الحلم في تعامله مع الناس، كما ستتعرف على حكم التيمم والمسح على الخفين موضحة مفهومي التيمم والمسح على الخفين، وتطبق التيمم والمسح على الخفين تطبيقاً صحيحاً وتقرن بين التيمم والمسح على الخفين، كما ستتعرف على أحداث غزوة الأحزاب وتحلل نتائج غزوة الأحزاب وتستخلص العبر من غزوة الأحزاب.

English

Students will read with the purpose of writing based upon themes, characters and setting within the novel 'The Island of the Blue Dolphins'. Students will write strong narrative original pieces of work with a focus on proper spelling, grammar, and conventions. Students will develop strategies in prewriting, drafting, revising and editing original pieces of work.

English Social Studies

Ancient Egypt

Seventh graders study the origins of human beings and the early civilizations that flourished in Egypt after having looked at ancient Mesopotamia. They study the religions, governments, trade, philosophies, and art of this civilization as well as the powerful ideas that arose in the ancient world and profoundly shaped the course of world history. These ideas include monotheism, democracy, the rule of law, individual worth, personal responsibility, the alphabetic principle for a writing system, and scientific reasoning where applicable to ancient Egypt. This unit is a follow on chronologically from the unit on Mesopotamia and sets the foundation for the subsequent study of further ancient civilisations throughout the academic school year.

Math

Unit 2: Rational Numbers

Students will understand that...

- Knowledge of positive and negative rational numbers are important in understanding and interpreting related real-world situations.
- By understanding and recognizing when the sum or product of two rational numbers is positive or negative, one is able to make a number of inferences.
- There are constant rules applied to adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing rational numbers.
- Computation with positive and negative rational numbers is often necessary to determine relationships between quantities.
- Models, diagrams, manipulatives, number lines, and patterns are useful in developing and remembering algorithms for computing with positive and negative rational numbers.
- Numerical representations can be used to describe and compare the value of real- world quantities.
- Relationships exist between positive and negative rational numbers.
- Every point on a line corresponds to a Real Number
- Understand that every fraction has a decimal equivalent but the inverse may not always be true.
- Understand that a rational number is the quotient of two integers.

Science

Students will learn more about the organisation of life, focusing on human organ systems. Students will start by recapping the organisation of cells into tissues, tissues into organs, and organs into organ systems, leading onto specific systems and how the body regulates specific conditions in order to keep the organism healthy. Students will learn what several body systems are used for and how they interact with each other, particularly focusing on digestion.

Students will be able to:

- Draw a diagram to explain the organisation of an organism.
- State what is meant by homeostasis.
- Describe how the body maintains homeostasis.
- Describe the passage through the digestive system.
- Explain how digestion works in the stomach and intestines.

- State the difference between the small and large intestine.
- Name the food groups and state where we can find each one and why we need it.

PE

Health Unit

This course aims to equip students with the relevant skills, knowledge and abilities in order for them to make informed healthy choices throughout their lifetime, which will encourage them to partake in lifelong physical activity and lifelong healthy eating habits. The focus of the course will be on individual reflection and identifying personalized targets for students, while the purpose will be to ensure all students have a working knowledge of how the body works and how diet and exercise can help develop an efficient and healthy body.

Physical Unit

This Soccer Module helps to achieve the standards set out by SHAPE America, as it will help the students to demonstrate fundamental motor skills in a variety of contexts; cooperate with and encourage classmates; accept individual differences and demonstrate inclusive behaviors; and engage in physical activity for enjoyment and self-expression. The focus will be on developing the skills required to participate effectively in Soccer, passing, dribbling, moving into space, defending, attacking, ball control and shooting. Students will also be required to develop their mental capacity as they demonstrate their ability to coach others using skill specific terminology and game tactics, as well as refereeing small sided games.

ICT

Introduction to Computer Systems

This unit will provide students with an understanding of the types and purposes of common computerized systems, also how to select those which are fit for a specified purpose. By the end of the unit, students should:

- Know what components comprise a computer system
- Be able to identify and state the purpose of computer hardware
- Recognize examples and understand the function of input/output devices
- Understand the concept of storage devices, be able to recognize common examples and state why they are fit for purpose

Drama

Becoming a Playwright

Students will understand and apply basic script conventions, collaborating as an ensemble of actors as they write their own scripts. The learners will be required to practice and apply the process of characterisation to all elements of this unit, embodying the art of playing a character with truth and creativity. The students will be expected to rehearse and perform their original scripts, focusing on the emotive, vocal and physical requirements of the character.

J'habite ici

This unit will continue to further develop students' listening, speaking, reading and writing skills and will expand their vocabulary, grammar and their cultural competence about France and French culture.

Language content:

- Students will be able to ask and say what country they come from and their nationality
- Students will be able to ask and say what city they live in
- Students will be able to say what type of a house they live in and describe its parts
- Students will be able to express likes dislikes about their house/city

Grammar:

- students will learn the conjugation of some verbs in 1st group, e.g., habiter, aimer, etc.
- students will learn what prepositions are used with countries, cities, etc

Cultural aspect:

- Students will have the opportunity to compare different sorts of houses in UAE and France
